

Getting Around New York State

New York State is bordered by Ontario, Quebec in Canada and Lake Ontario in the north, the Atlantic Ocean, Pennsylvania and New Jersey to the south, Vermont, Connecticut and Massachusetts to the East and Lake Erie to the West.

New York State has excellent transport facilities and links which makes getting around the state and traveling onward within the US and internationally easy.

Travelling by air

New York State is served by two major airport hubs: JFK International Airport and Newark Liberty International Airport, in New Jersey. LaGuardia Airport is New York City's major domestic hub. All three airports provide services to regional New York State airports, which include:

Travelling by train

New York City is a hub for trains on the east coast, with connections locally and across the USA. Amtrak offer two 'classic' train journeys from the new Moynihan Station in NYC, the Empire and Adirondack services.

Amtrak's Adirondack Service takes you north along the Hudson River, past historic West Point and up to Hudson Valley to Albany the state capital and continues through the Adirondacks and up to Montreal.

From Albany, Amtrak's Empire Service travels West along the old Mohawk Trail through Central New York stopping at Syracuse and Rochester in the wine country of the Finger Lakes and on to Buffalo and Niagara Falls.

New York City

New York City needs no introduction! NYC is made up of five boroughs - the Bronx, Brooklyn, Manhattan, Queens and Staten Island, each with dozens of neighbourhoods lending their own local flavour. The city provides an endless array of attractions and activities. Choose sightseeing tours, visit landmarks and museums, experience the city at night, enjoy a club, sample culinary delights or take in a Broadway show. Stroll around Central Park or one of the many world-famous department stores or boutiques.

Long Island

Only minutes from Manhattan, find everything you need for a getaway! You've heard about the famous whitesand beaches and the world class wineries, fresh local produce and seafood. Long Island was named one of the world's Top 10 wine regions and boasts top-rated restaurants. Two beaches regularly head Dr. Beach's celebrated Top 10 list.

Hudson Valley

Scenery, historic mansions, cultural treasures and unique attractions-National Geographic Traveller named this region a Top 20 Best of the World Destination! From restaurants to gardens and performing arts, creativity thrives amid inspiring landscapes. Celebrated chefs create farm-to-table cuisine at country inns and the worldfamous Culinary Institute of America. With abundant farm markets, awardwinning wineries, craft-breweries and food festivals, Hudson Valley dining is legendary.

The Catskills

Artists, writers and naturalists draw inspiration from its tranquil forests, explorers and families find magic on its high peaks--this is the Catskills, your clients' mountain getaway and next adventure. Take an open-air ride on the Catskill Mountain Railroad or walk the Hudson River School Art Trail to see Thomas Cole's 19th-century paintings. Whether clients bike along miles of mountain trails in the Catskill Preserve, swim in the sparkling lakes or hike to new heights on the mountain peaks, they are in for an outdoor adventure.

Capital-Saratoga

Discover world-class arts, fascinating history and culinary treats, from Buffalo Wings at the legendary Anchor Bar to winepairing dinners along the Niagara Wine Trail.

Chautaugua-Allegheny

Tucked into timeless landscapes-enchanted mountains, tranquil lakes and bountiful vineyards--clients will find gracious hospitality and big adventure. Allegany and Lake Erie state parks--vast playgrounds with beaches, trails, bridle paths, and boating--have hundreds of cabins and campsites. Midway State Park on Chautauqua Lake features a century-old amusement park, fishing and free docking for day visitors.

New York State Overnight Adventure Tours

With the Adirondacks being the largest park in the USA outside of Alaska, numerous glacial lakes forming the Finger Lakes, a global icon in Niagara Falls and the hidden sunken forest off Long Island, New York State is the place for adventure. With the help of New York State adventure tour organisers, your clients can escape into nature. Here is a sample of an adventure tour that NYS offers:

Western Adirondacks – Fulton Chain Circuit itinerary (5 nights / 4 days) Adirondack Hamlet to Huts www.adkh2h.org

The Fulton Chain circuit itinerary in the Adirondacks consists of two days of scenic paddling and two days of either hiking or gravel biking alongside lakes and through rich forest, including the White Pine Forest. The Fulton chain of lakes is a string of eight lakes surrounded by the Adirondacks Mountains in central Adirondacks. It is a great place to hike, bike and fish, while all the waterways make this a kayakers and rafters paradise, plus it has excellent shoreline camping facilities.

Day one – you'll paddle First Lake through Fourth Lake, from Old Forge to Inlet, where you'll enjoy the views of the mountains and hills that rim the lakes while checking out the varied architecture of the luxury mountain lodges and camps along the way.

Day two – you'll paddle to gorgeous Raquette Lake via Fifth through Eighth lakes and the winding Brown's Tract. The cosy feel and tasty cooking of the Raquette Lake Hotel and Taproom will make you feel at home at this popular "have-it-all" local establishment.

Day three – you'll switch travel modes and either hike or bike back to Old Forge the next two days. Hikers make their way up and over Black Bear Mountain with its awesome views to the southeast en route to Inlet. Bikers cruise the Dillon and Uncas roads to Inlet with the option to also hike up Black Bear.

Day four and five – hikers travel 13 miles from Inlet back to Old Forge, including climbs up Rocky Mountain and Bald (Rondaxe) Mountain with their impressive views of some of the lakes you previously paddled. Bikers cover 15 miles on the TOBIE trail with the option to add another 6.5 miles by looping through Thendara (old forge) and visiting Elise Lookout.

New York State Cycling Tours

New York State offers numerous cycling tours, from half day leisurely excursions to overnight tours with accompanying support vehicles. The geography of New York state is perfect for beginners or experienced cyclists. Here are two sample cycling tours available through local suppliers.

Empire State Trail www.empiretrail.ny.gov

The Empire State Trail is one of New York's newest attractions; it is a 750-mile trail for walkers, hikers, runners, cyclists, in fact it is for anyone who wants to enjoy New York's great outdoors. The trail has three routes, two from New York City north to the Canadian border running along the Hudson valley to Albany and then onto Canada through the Champlain Valley, with another route heading west following the Erie Canal from Albany to Buffalo.

Empire State Trail Vacation Tour (5 Nights / 6 Days) **Gotham Bicycle Tours** www.gothambiketours.com

Gotham Bicycle Tours offer an organised six day cycle tour between New York City and Saratoga Springs in the Hudson Valley. The tour takes in the Lower Hudson Valley, the Catskills, Albany and the capital region, and the spa town of Saratoga Springs.

Riders are given a GPS and maps, while guides will travel with all groups in a support vehicle which is always nearby, carrying luggage and setting up rest stops. Bespoke tours can also be arranged across the state. The itinerary features:

Day one - NYC to Yonkers (24 miles) - head out of the city along the Hudson River for a short ride to Yonkers experiencing the start of the Empire State Trail.

Day two - Yonkers to Lower Hudson Valley (46 miles) - The Empire State Trail takes you all the way to the last stop, but only after you pass through charming villages and hamlets that are nestled amongst farms, forests and the massive reservoirs that supply water to our thirsty metropolis.

Day three - Lower Hudson Valley to Lower Appalachian Crossing (40-50 miles) - the Empire State Trail follows a former railroad line that once connected New England to the Hudson River. Riders will cross the great Appalachian Trail with its famous white blazes.

Day four - Lower Appalachian Crossing to the Catskills (40-60 miles) - the most scenic day of the tour with near-constant vistas of mountains, rivers, farms and historic areas. Riders get to ride over a huge railroad bridge, pass through bucolic college campuses, and end in the historic City of Hudson.

Day five - Catskills to Capital Region (39 miles) - make your way to Albany, the state capital, on another great bike path built atop a former trolley line that used to carry commuters to the capital.

Day six - Capital Region to Saratoga Springs (42 miles) – ending the trail in Saratoga Springs, known for its "Health, History and Horses". This is a beautiful city that has long been associated with its healing waters and spas, so it's a great place to rest and relax.

NY Finger Lakes Bike Tour – Winery Stay Discovery Bicycle Tours (7 Nights / 6 Days) www.discoverybicycletours.com

This tour of the Finger Lakes region of upstate New York takes riders along the two largest of the Finger Lakes, Cayuga and Seneca — and one of the most scenic, Keuka.

Your riders start and finish in the vibrant college town of Ithaca, known for its river gorges. Explore several of the area's iconic small towns, including Hammondsport, Watkins Glen, Seneca Falls and Ovid. Listen for the osprey and kingfisher birds calling as riders enjoy the combination of lake views and classic farm country.





Day one – Ithaca to Seneca Falls (25 – 30 Miles) – a quiet roll out of town onto the highlands above Cayuga Lake for lunch, with the afternoon's ride continuing along the lake, ending in the Montezuma Wildlife Refuge.

Day two – Seneca Falls Circular route (25-60 miles) - climb up onto the plateau between Cayuga and Seneca Lakes to be rewarded by expansive views of Cayuga Lake. In the afternoon enter Sampson State Park via a bike-only trail along the lake.

Day three – Seneca Falls to Glenora Winery (35-47 miles) – Riders wind their way along the ridge above Seneca Lake, watching for the buggies of the local Amish. Roll into Glenora Winery in time to clean up, enjoy the pool and meet for a wine tasting before dinner.

Day four – Glenora Winery Circular route (27-62 miles) - The primary ride starts at Waneta Lake and finishes at Keuka Lake State Park for a swim on the beach. The long option for the day starts and ends at Glenora, featuring the full 62-mile (100 km) loop around Keuka Lake.

Day five - Glenora Winery to Ithaca (32-52 miles) -The longer version of the ride starts at Glenora and rolls along Seneca Lake down into Watkins Glen. Or riders can skip the climb and start high above the eastern shore of Seneca Lake. Enjoy this route along miles of wineries on the hills above the lake, with plenty of opportunities for tastings.

Day six – Ithaca circular route (15 miles) – Riders can enjoy a short morning ride around the north side of Ithaca, with stops at Cornell's famous Laboratory of Ornithology and Sapsucker Woods... and a scenic roll through the arboretum, wildflower and botanic gardens.

New York State Hub & Spoke Itineraries

If visitors want to stay in one location for a few days or a week to discover what is nearby, then clients can consider 'hub and spoke' stays in destinations with great connections, attractions, activities and eating options. Here are two possible options for your trade programmes.

Poughkeepsie, Hudson Valley

Poughkeepsie is located in Dutchess County, which is located in south-eastern New York State, between the Hudson River on its west and the New York-Connecticut border on its east, about halfway between the cities of Albany and New York. It is a nature lover's paradise, sitting in the Hudson Valley and close to the Taconic Mountain range.

It is an easy drive 1.5-2 hours drive from New York City and it is a great way to experience the northern Hudson Valley and the Adirondacks. Here are just some of the great things to do in and around Dutchess County:

Walkway Over the Hudson State Historic Park

The Hudson Valley's most unique state park, Walkway Over the Hudson State Historic Park is the world's longest elevated pedestrian bridge (1.28 miles). The bridge spans the Hudson River, offering great views of the Hudson Valley. The linear park, 212 feet above the river, was created on an abandoned railroad bridge originally opened in 1889 as the Poughkeepsie-Highland Railroad Bridge. Today the Walkway links to a rail trail on the Highland side. Walk, bike, or run across.

Dutchess Wine Trail

The Dutchess Wine Trail is located amid rural eastern Dutchess County connecting Clinton Vineyards, Milea Estate Vineyard and Millbrook Vineyards & Winery. The three wineries are within fifteen minutes driving time of one another. The trail leads you past the vineyards, orchards, and farms that provide the bounty of this valley. There are many restaurants, country inns, bed & breakfasts surrounding the Dutchess Wine Trail.

FDR Presidential Library and Museum

This Museum is located at the former family home of President Franklin D Roosevelt. This acclaimed museum and the presidential library features special interactives, immersive audio visual theatres, and rarely seen artefacts that convey the dramatic story of the Roosevelt era. The exhibits tell the story of the Roosevelt presidency, beginning in the depths of the Great Depression and continuing through the New Deal years and World War II.

The Culinary Institute of America

The Culinary Institute of America has been setting the standard for excellence in professional culinary education for more than 70 years. Founded in 1946, The Culinary Institute of America is the world's premier culinary college. While in the area visitors must stop by and dine at one of five award winning restaurants staffed by future celebrity chefs.

Appalachian Trail – The Harlem Valley AT Community

Thirty miles of the National Appalachian Scenic Trail passes through southeastern Dutchess, and includes 4,000 acres of protected parkland with hiking, backpacking, snowshoeing, and cross-country skiing. The valley is part of the 2,190-mile-long Appalachian Mountain landscape known as the Wild East. Only an hour train ride from New York City (65 miles) where visitors can explore 16 miles of the A.T. through Dover and Pawling, with hikes ranging in ability from easy rolling terrain to rock scrambles.

Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome

Vintage World War I era biplanes still fly in regular air shows at the Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome in Rhinebeck. At this living history museum, one of the country's largest collections of antique airplanes is presented in an outdoor setting, with aircraft including a 1902 Wright Glider, a British Sopwith Camel, German Fokkers, and other mainstays of World War I dogfights, as well as relics from aviation history. Visitors can even ride in a vintage biplane.







Ithaca, The Finger Lakes

Ithaca is a four-hour drive north-west of New York City and is a great base to explore the Finger Lakes region. The town sits at the base of the longest Finger Lake, Seneca Lake that stretches for 38.1 miles, while the other ten finger lakes nearby provide stunning scenery formed from ancient glaciers thousands of years ago. The geography also provides the Finger Lakes with its own climate and eco system.

Waterfalls - Ithaca Waterfalls are "Gorges"

A local saying goes, "Ithaca is GORGES!" With over 150 waterfalls within 10 miles, you can understand why. Ithaca and the surrounding area was literally carved out by glaciers that formed gorges millions of years ago. Even in downtown Ithaca you can follow downtown walking trails to discover three falls; Businessman's Lunch, Cascadilla Falls and Ithaca Falls.

Corning's famous Museum of Glass

The Corning Museum of Glass is a museum in Corning dedicated to the art, history and science of glass. It has a collection of more than 50,000 glass objects, some over 3,500 years old. Globally renowned, it offers a unique opportunity to see glass in a new light, featuring the stunning Contemporary Art + Design Wing and live hot glassmaking demos.

The Finger Lakes

The lakes lie within a triangle between Syracuse, Rochester and Elmira-Corning. Forests and park surround the lakes, with hiking, cycling, boat tours, paddle boarding, kayaking and canoeing all popular, along with lazing on the beaches!

Wine tasting

The Finger Lakes region is probably best known for award-winning wines. The natural setting and growing experience of winemakers is making for high quality red and white wines. Tours can be taken of vineyards that include tastings of locally produced wine.

Watkins Glen State Park

Watkins Glen State Park is the most famous of the Finger Lakes State Parks. Within two miles, the glen's stream descends 400 feet, past 200-foot cliffs, generating 19 waterfalls along its course.

Letchworth State Park

Letchworth State Park, renowned as the "Grand Canyon of the East," is one of the most scenically magnificent areas in the eastern U.S. The Genesee River roars through the gorge over three major waterfalls between cliffs, as high as 600 feet in some places -surrounded by lush forests. Hikers can choose from 66 miles of hiking trails.

Women's Rights National Historical Park

Women's Rights National Historical Park tells the story of the first Women's Rights Convention held in Seneca Falls, NY on July 19-20, 1848. It features exhibits, an inspirational film, and restored historical buildings, including the home of Elizabeth Cady Stanton and the Wesleyan Chapel where the Convention was held in 1848.

George Eastman Museum

Founded in 1947, the George Eastman Museum is the world's oldest photography museum and one of the largest film archives in the United States, located on the National Historic Landmark estate of entrepreneur and philanthropist George Eastman, the pioneer of popular photography.



New York State Classic Air Tour Itinerary

An easy extension from New York City, travellers can experience the legendary falls, try Buffalo wings where they were created and explore castles dotted around the 1,000 islands. This is all within 90 minutes flying time of New York City.

Itineraries can be self-guided or as part of a group with attractions and experiences tailored to customer needs, whether that be active or gentle. The trip can also be completed by hire car and Amtrak train on the Empire Service.

Sample 3-day / 2-night air tour itinerary:

Depart New York City flying direct to Buffalo Niagara International Airport in just 75 minutes on Delta Airlines, United Airlines or jetBlue. Stay at Niagara Falls for front row Falls seats or stay in Buffalo and absorb the great atmosphere in the home of the Buffalo wing.

First stop for visitors will be **Niagara Falls State Park**, America's first state park, giving views of the three falls. Take the Maid of the Mist boat ride right up to the thundering waters! With the **Cave of the Winds**, get closer to the Falls than ever imagined when visitors descend 175 feet into the Niagara Gorge and experience the power of the falls from the Hurricane Deck. Or, relax aboard the **Niagara Scenic Trolley** as it gives visitors a narrated tour of the park. After dark, see the majestic falls illuminated in colours (until 2am)!




